Featured Speakers Include :

Barry Minkow - Former convicted con artist who served seven years in a federal penitentiary, now a recognized fraud expert. Mr. Minkow works frequently with the FBI and speaks to executives and investors about the techniques criminals use to deceive victims. Author of *Cleaning Up*, Minkow has appeared on *60 Minutes*, CNN and CNBC.

David Zimmerman, Ph.D. - President of the nation's foremost healthcare independent monitor organization, responsible for verifying compliance with state and federal court-issued permanent injunctions and consent orders. He will speak on how to build a case against a poor performing healthcare facility.

Brian Donnelly, Ph.D. - Dr. Donnelly spent twenty-one years as a special agent with the FBI investigating cases involving medical serial killers and healthcare crimes. He will present on the use of poisons in the death of patients and the issues surrounding correct identification and analysis.

Mark Safarik - Supervisory Special Agent, Behavioral Analysis Unit, FBI Academy - SSA Safarik has conducted extensive research on sexual assault crimes and homicides of elderly women. SSA Safarik will explain how behavioral analyses has been used to help solve hundreds of difficult crimes.

George Williamson, J.D. - Solano County District Attorney's Office. A veteran prosecutor of numerous high profile homicide and public corruption cases, this former Chief of the CA Department of Justice's Division of Criminal Law is a recognized expert in the art of the cross-examination of expert defense witnesses, and used these skills in the successful prosecution of multiple-murderer, Cary Stayner.

Naomi Karp, J.D. - An attorney and senior policy advisor at AARP's Public Policy Institute in Washington, DC. As a guardianship expert and author of the first national study on guardianship monitoring in 15 years, Karp will discuss current and promising court practices in monitoring this powerful legal tool that can bring good or ill for an increasing number of vulnerable adults with cognitive impairments.

Daniel Sheridan, Ph.D. - Registered Nurse and Professor of Nursing at Johns Hopkins University. He will give participants insight into the causes of bruising, utilizing numerous visual aides and case histories. Was the incident the by-product of aging, medication or the result of abuse? Forensic medical terminology will be presented in a user-friendly format.

Solomon Liao, M.D. - Assistant Clinical Professor at UC Irvine, Department of Medicine, specializing in geriatric medicine. Professor Liao will take participants through an in-depth look at pressure ulcers, malnutrition and dehydration and when those issues are the result of aging, medication or neglect by a caregiver.

Presiding Justice Roger W. Boren - Administrative Presiding Justice of the California Second Appellate District. Judge Boren was recently appointed by the Chief Justice of California as chair of the Task Force on Probate Conservatorships, charged with improving the practices and administration of probate conservatorships.

Linda Purdy - An Assistant Attorney General for the State of Vermont for 19 years. Since 1997, she has been the Director of the Vermont Attorney General's Medicaid Fraud and Residential Abuse Unit specializing in prosecuting healthcare provider fraud, resident abuse and neglect cases. Ms. Purdy served as the President of the National Association of Medicaid Fraud Control Units in 2006 and Vice President in 2005. She is cross-designated as a Special Assistant United States Attorney for healthcare fraud cases. Ms. Purdy is an adjunct professor at the Vermont Law School, where she teaches trial practice.


