The California Department of Justice, Office of the Attorney General, is accepting applications from law students for its 2008 Public Rights Division Summer Honors Program. Law students participating in the Public Rights Division Summer Honors Program will spend up to 12 weeks as an intern with one of the eleven sections within the Public Rights Division. Summer Honors Program positions will be available in the following cities and areas of law for 2008:

- **Los Angeles:** Antitrust Law; Consumer Law; Civil Rights Enforcement; Energy and Corporate Responsibility; Land/Environment/Natural Resources.
- **Sacramento:** Civil Rights Enforcement; Energy and Corporate Responsibility; False Claims; Land/Environment/Natural Resources; Tobacco Litigation and Enforcement.
- **Oakland:** Civil Rights Enforcement; Energy and Corporate Responsibility; Land/Environment/Natural Resources; Tobacco Litigation and Enforcement.
- **San Francisco:** Antitrust Law; Energy and Corporate Responsibility; Consumer Law; False Claims; Natural Resources.
- **San Diego:** Consumer Law; Land/Environment/Natural Resources; Tobacco Litigation and Enforcement.

Student and volunteer positions will be available for the 2008 Summer Honors Program. Some students may be able to receive academic credit for their work. Public interest and other types of grants may be available.

Submit a resume, writing sample and cover letter indicating your preferred practice areas and cities.
