¹The offender is actually a suspect at the time of reporting. Homicide data is extracted from Supplemental Homicide Report (SHR) and initial crime reports with no follow-up to verify that the identified suspect actually committed or was adjudicated of the crime.

²Other family* includes son, daughter, in-law, etc.

³Other* includes acquaintance, stranger, and other.
