Thank you for taking the time to review the following California Missing Person Bulletin. This on-line Bulletin provides summary information on cases involving missing children, emancipated juveniles (persons reported missing as a juvenile who are not over the age of 17), dependent adults, and voluntary missing adults. The missing children are categorized by school level: preschool, primary and secondary.

This Bulletin is updated twice weekly and includes all active missing person cases for which the Department of Justice (DOJ) has received a photograph. We ask that you make this Bulletin available to others within your organization to improve the chance that a featured missing person will be recognized and ultimately returned to safety.

USING THIS BULLETIN

1. Please carefully review the photographs, physical descriptions and names of the missing persons contained in this bulletin.
2. Keep in mind that the physical appearances of the missing persons may have changed. All physical information was obtained at the time the person was reported missing and the picture is the most recent available at that time.
3. Also keep in mind that after children have been abducted by strangers or non-custodial parents, they may have been enrolled in schools under different names.

GLOSSARY OF MISSING PERSON DATA FIELDS

Following is a list of abbreviations and their meaning for the data field codes in the Quarterly Bulletin.

NAME	-	Name of the missing person
ALIAS	-	Alias name of the missing person
SEX	-	Sex of the missing person
RACE	-	Race
DOB	-	Date of Birth
HGT	-	Height
WGT	-	Weight
HAI	-	Hair Color
EYE	-	Eye Color

POSSIBLE REASON MISSING - Type of missing person case as reported by law enforcement agencies:

STRANGER ABDUCTION	-	Missing person taken by a stranger (Includes cases of a known abductor who is not a family member).
PARENTAL/FAMILY ABDUCTION	-	Missing juvenile taken by a parent or non-parental family member.
RUNAWAY	-	Missing juvenile is reported as a runaway or is not wanted by his/her parents.
SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES	-	Person missing under circumstances that may indicate foul play.
CATASTROPHE	-	Missing person is a victim of a disaster (i.e., boating accident, plane crash, earthquake, flood, fire).
LOST	-	Missing person who has strayed away and whose whereabouts are unknown.
UNKNOWN	-	Person missing where circumstances surrounding disappearance are unknown.
DEPENDENT ADULT	-	Missing adult age 18 or older who has physical or mental limitations which restrict his/her ability to carry out normal activities.

LOC LAST SEEN	-	Location where the missing person was last seen (i.e., residence, foster/group home, school, shopping center, amusement center, concert, receiving home/shelter)
DATE MISSING	-	Date the missing person was last seen
REPORTING AGY	-	Reporting agency name
AGY CASE NUM	-	Reporting agency case number
AGY PHONE NUM	-	Reporting agency phone number
AGE IN PHOTO	-	Age at the time the photograph was taken
FCN#	-	Department of Justice file control number
